Kelly's Mom died May 2018. Kelly moved in with her Dad, Clay, in September 2018. Clay had not squared danced for many years because Val was unable to do so. Clay wanted to brush up on square dancing and invited Kelly to join him. Kelly graduated in March of 2019. Kelly enjoys square dancing, likes meeting people, and going dancing at the other clubs. If you see Kelly pulling a large cooler, she is bringing the regular pop to the Hotfoot dances while Jerry & Fran bring the diet pop. Kelly also has subbed for Sharon in the kitchen.

Kelly was born in Indiana, lived there 1961-63 and then lived in Kentucky for 3 years. Kelly's family then moved in May, 1967 to Spring Lake Park, MN. Kelly has two sisters - Linda (oldest) and Laurie; Kelly is the youngest. With her family Kelly went camping and travelling locally to Coon Lake each year plus Yellowstone, Mt. Rushmore, Itasca (origin of Mississippi river), and the Grotto in Iowa. At age 11, Kelly started working for her Dad at some of his work places including as a dishwasher at the Country Kitchen restaurant and at a New Year's Eve square dance at the Newman Center where she and a friend bussed tables and filled snacks and beverages. Kelly went 2 years to Anoka Ramsey Community College (80-82) to be a legal secretary. In 82-83 she worked as a Receptionist in a legal office and then in 83-87

worked at Honeywell as a Secretary for the Finance Dept.

In 1985 Kelly met Ted Landwehr at a Lutheran Singles Retreat in Mequon, WI. He was from Elgin, IL. They were married in Spring Lake Park in May, 1987, went to Israel and Egypt on their honeymoon, and moved to DeKalb, IL. In the Fall of '87 to Spring of '88, Kelly was a student at Northern IL. University studying to be a Hearing Impaired Teacher but the program did not meet her expectations. In 1989, they moved to Columbia Heights, MN, and their 2 daughters were born there. Ted, Kelly and their daughters took camping trips to Yellowstone, Mt. Rushmore, Disney World & Disneyland plus also did many local camping trips.

If you remember Clay's recent Spotlight, he loves to cook and so does Kelly! Now that they are living together again, Clay does a lot of the cooking during the week since Kelly works and she does most of the cooking on the weekends. Kelly prefers to eat gluten free and is always looking for new recipes. Kelly delights in searching for healthy foods/recipes in the book series Trim Healthy Mama. She also is very "social" and likes getting together with friends to eat and socialize. She also plays tennis, goes on walks, and keeps in touch with her daughters. Her faith is very important and she enjoys reading the bible. In the past Kelly taught Sunday school and Vacation Bible School and participated in youth activities at church with her daughters. Kelly has been a befriender to Sharon, an elderly woman in a nursing home, for 5-6 years. Sharon had cerebral palsy and had difficulty talking so she used a typewriter to communicate before recently passing.

Kelly has been working for 6 years as a Special Ed Para at the Spring Lake Park Schools. She works with K-3 students who have Autism. She has a difficult job but thinks that God has put her there to love these kids. Kelly was interviewed prior to the Pandemic. Kelly's job has since changed. During the Pandemic, she has been working M-F 10 AM-1PM doing child care for First Responders and for medical personnel.
